

2011 Kershaw County School District Secondary Summer School

General Information

The home high school will host Secondary Summer School for 2011. Students are allowed to take summer courses only if taking a course in which they have previously been unsuccessful or if the student received a certificate at graduation and needs the course to receive his/her diploma. Students who failed a course with a final grade from 61-69 are eligible for credit recovery. A student may take 2 credit recovery courses or 1 initial credit course during summer school.

***Content Recovery:** *Students taking credit recovery courses for previously failed coursework (must have a grade in that course between 61 and 69) will receive maximum passing grade of 70 after satisfactorily completing a course. The grade of 70 replaces any other grade earned.*

Attendance and Credit Requirements

All summer school courses meet Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and State Department of Education standards for one unit of credit. Students MUST be present in class for 120 hours and satisfactorily complete all assigned work for full credit courses. Credit recovery will be offered for some courses. Students who miss more than two days will be unable to make up the work and, therefore, will not receive credit. In this event, no refund will be given.

Fees

The tuition for summer courses is \$250.00 per course for one-unit courses. American Government or Economics is for .5 credit and credit recovery courses are \$125.00 each. For students living outside of Kershaw County, the cost of a course is \$350.00.

Cashiers check, cash, or money orders should be made payable to the home high school. All fees ***must*** be paid in full at registration to the bookkeeper. All monies must be receipted by the bookkeeper. **There will be no exceptions!**

Full refund will be made if there is insufficient enrollment, or if a student withdraws before the second day of class, Tuesday, June 7, 2011. Refunds are made through the Kershaw County School District office, not by the home high school by the request of the principal. You can expect a minimum two-week waiting period for refunds. There will be no refunds approved after June 7, 2011.

Note: Secondary Summer School is entirely funded by tuition received from students enrolled in the program. Therefore, these fee collection rules are required in order to obtain teachers prior to the beginning of the program.

Note: Initial credit courses need a minimum of 13 students for the course to make.

Students should note these important reminders:

- ◆ Be on time for class and remain for the entire period.
- ◆ Conduct yourselves maturely.
- ◆ Be reminded that the Kershaw County Code of Student Conduct will be enforced during the summer program.
- ◆ Wear appropriate clothing and footwear.
- ◆ Students will be permitted to leave campus for lunch. Lunch is forty-five minutes. **No cafeteria services will be offered.** Snack and drink machines will be available.
- ◆ Be aware that failure to adhere to these expectations may result in termination from the summer program without a refund.
